The Seasons of Lent and Easter

The season of Lent is upon us. Lent is traditionally a time of spiritual renewal. During these forty days, from Ash Wednesday (February 14) to Easter Sunday (March 31), Christians are urged to pray and to meditate anew on the Gospel accounts of Christ's redemptive passion and death.

If we open our hearts to God's Word this Lent, we will discover many spiritual life-or-death questions that are asked of us: "Am I really trying to love God?" "Do I act as if I'll never die?" "Am I willing to repent?" "Do I really love anyone but myself?" Such are the questions posed by Lent. Take a moment during Lent to conduct your own spiritual inventory. What is the most important thing to you in your life? What do you most like about your life? What do you like least about your life? If you had only one message to give to the people you care most about, what would that message be? Is there any person in the world, or any cause, that -- if circumstances called for it -- you would be willing to die for? If this were the last day in your life, what would you do with it? These are not easy questions. But then, Lent is not intended to be an easy time! Please note: The above questions are from noted author Rev. Frederick Buechner, my religion teacher many years ago.

During Lent, we prepare for Easter. The final week of Lent, Holy Week, is the most intense preparation and begins Palm Sunday, on March 24, followed by Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services on March 28 and 29 respectively. And then there's Easter! If Lent has been a time for reflection, Easter is the moment for celebration! On Easter Sunday, we celebrate the true high point of the Christian year - the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. This is what Christianity is all about! And Easter is not only one Sunday. Easter is an entire season of seven (7) Sundays of Easter starting March 31 and leading up to Pentecost Sunday on May 19.

May the reflection time of Lent and the celebration time of Easter be a truly blessed time for you!

Lent and Holy Week in Allentown 2024

Lent and Holy Week Observances in Allentown ~ Pastor Mathisen

St. Luke's is a member of the Allentown Collaborative Ministries (ACM), a coalition of mostly Lutheran churches that have also added several other churches.

Below is the schedule for services during Lent:

Lenten Midweek Gatherings, February 21, 28, and March 6, 13, and 20 - Lenten Midweek Gatherings will again be held at noon at St. Timothy's Lutheran Church. The noontime food will be prepared by the various congregations. St. Luke's will be assisting First Presbyterian Church with the food on Wednesday, March 20th.

Holy Week - During Holy Week, there will be joint services for Maundy Thursday on March 28 and Good Friday on March 29, as well as observance of the Easter Vigil on Saturday evening March 30:

- The Maundy Thursday service will be at Redeemer Lutheran Church at noon, with the evening service at Nativity Lutheran Church at 7:30 p.m.
- The Good Friday noontime service will again be hosted by us at St. Luke's, from noon to 3:00 p.m. It will again be led by Pastor Maritza Torres Dolich reviewing the Stations of the Cross, which was very well appreciated last year.
- The Good Friday evening service will be at St. John's Lutheran Church at 7:30 p.m.
- The observance of the Easter Vigil will be held at Christ Lutheran Church at 7:30 p.m.

The evening services will have a joint choir. Of course, all participating churches will plan and conduct their own services on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday.

We encourage all members of St. Luke's to attend these community worship services and educational opportunities in Allentown as you are able!

Property Highlights - February 2024

- Replaced the broken wireless doorbell for the west side courtyard door. Relocated it onto the first-floor Fellowship Hall wall in the hallway across from the elevator.
- Paul Wright Roofing replaced the third-floor roofing material. Also replaced the shingles on the third-floor front Mansard wall and on the dormer of the apartment.
- Burkholder's should be starting the replacement of the A/C units around March 11, 2024.

Staffan's older brother, Anders, still lives in Hong Kong. The Zimmermans are in touch with him as well and are keeping the tradition of their families' relationship into another generation.
